About

The Practical Nursing Program is approved by the Tennessee Board of Nursing. Graduates will obtain a diploma in Practical Nursing and may then be eligible to take the National Council Licensing Exam for Practical Nursing (NCLEX-PN) used to obtain nursing licensure in Tennessee.

Practical Nursing is entry level nursing. Graduates are prepared with the background and skills to give knowledgeable, basic nursing care to patients with varying degrees of physical needs.

Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) work under the supervision of registered nurses and doctors. Positions are available in hospitals, long term care facilities, physician's offices, home health agencies, and in industry.

ALLIED HEALTH ADMISSIONS CHECKLIST

All Allied Health applicants for Dental Assisting, Practical Nursing, and Surgical Technology must submit an application by visiting www.tcatknoxville.edu/future-students/admissions.

In addition to submitting an application, it is recommended that all applicants complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at www.studentaid.gov to see if they are eligible for financial assistance to fund their education.

Applicants must submit all general admissions requirements, program specific requirements, and point system documentation, if required by program. All requirements must be received by the published deadline to be considered for acceptance. Completion of admissions does not guarantee acceptance into the program.

Requirements for Allied Health Applicants

- All applicants must be 18 years old by the start of trimester.
- The following documentation, as well as any other program specific requirements, must be collected and submitted at the same time.
 - Immunizations
 - 2 Series of MMR or proof of immunity (titers)
 - 2 series of Varicella or proof of immunity (titers)
 - An official sealed High School Transcript or an equivalent.
 - An up-to-date CPR card from American Heart Association in Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers.
 - HESI Exam Scores (minimum scores provided on right)

Required HESI Exam Scores by Program

Dental Assisting:
50 Math, 70 Reading

Practical Nursing:
70 Math, 70 Reading

Surgical Technology:
50 Math, 70 Reading

Additional Practical Nursing Requirements:

- **Declaration of Citizenship Form.** Must be completed and notarized.
- **Three Letters of Recommendation.**
- **Points System Documentation.** Provide documentation of the following certifications, coursework, or activities and earn points towards your application. *See instructions for this documentation on the next page.*

Additional Surgical Tech Requirements:

- **Point System Documentation.** Provide documentation of the following certifications, coursework, or activities and earn points towards your application. *See instructions for this documentation on the next page.*

If you have taken the listed classes before applying to Surgical Technology and have scored an A or B in the class, these classes can be counted as points towards your application.

PRACTICAL NURSING POINTS SYSTEM FOR PROGRAM ENTRY

Please take careful note of the point system breakdown below. All documentation must be submitted **before** the application deadline to be awarded these points. To ensure accuracy, we ask that all documentation is received at once.

1) HESI Exam Scores

Students must meet the required pass scores to submit their HESI results for admissions. The score for the HESI Math portion must be 70 or above. The score for the HESI Reading portion must be 70 or above.

The number of points awarded is determined by adding together the HESI Math and Reading scores. The lowest number of points an applicant can be awarded is 140 points.

2) Copy of Tennessee CNA License

Submit a copy of your current (unexpired) Tennessee Certified Nursing Aide certification. For this documentation, applicants are awarded 30 points.

3) Attend a Practical Nursing Information Session

Attending a Practical Nursing Information Session in the last twelve months will earn an applicant 15 points towards admission. Below are the information sessions scheduled for 2024.
