CDL REFRESHER

Do you have a Commercial Driver License (CDL) Class A or B license but have been off the road for a while? The professional truck driving instructors at TCAT Knoxville can help you get back on the road with confidence. TCAT Knoxville provides a 40 hour refresher course for individuals with recent driving experience that need to sharpen their past skills. If you need to document your driving abilities for a potential employer, you must successfully complete an evaluation of your pre-trip planning, range maneuvering, and road handling. The refresher course is custom scheduled and setup as one-on-one sessions with an instructor. Please contact Yolanda Williams for more information at (865)766-4341. Cost: \$980

Prerequisite: Current class A or B CDL license and DOT physical card

INTRODUCTION TO MEDICAL INSURANCE CODING AND BILLING

This 80 hour course includes medical terminology, insurance coding, and procedures used in medical offices. Cost: \$646

INTERMEDIATE MEDICAL INSURANCE CODING AND BILLING

A continuation of the introductory class, this 80 hour course provides more advanced coding and billing skills. A review of the CPC National Certification Examination which includes correct procedural terminology, ICD-10, and HCPCS manuals will be used as resources to interpret guidelines for appropriate diagnostic and procedural codes, as well as mock patient scenarios. Cost: \$730

Prerequisite: 3 years of experience in Medical Billing and Coding or previous course in Medical Billing and Coding.

REVIEW FOR CERTIFIED PROFESSIONAL CODERS EXAMINATION

This 24 hour course is a review for the CPC National Certification Examination. Correct procedural terminology, ICD-10, and HCPCS manuals will be used as resources to interpret guidelines for appropriate diagnostic and procedural codes as well as mock patient scenarios. Cost: \$307

Prerequisite: Adequate knowledge of medical terminology and two years of medical coding and billing experience, or educational equivalent. Required book: ICD-10-CM for Physicians: 2017: v. 1 & 2.

CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT - 10 Points*

Students enrolled in this state approved course will be trained to provide direct care to patients. Employment opportunities include: Assisted Living, Home Health, Long-Term Care Facilities, Hospitals, and Hospice. CPR is taught as a part of the course. The CPR for BLS course will be taught from 4 pm - 9 pm for the evening students. Cost: \$765

Day Class: 120 Clock Hours Night Class: 126 Clock Hours

IMPORTANT NOTE ABOUT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK AND DRUG SCREEN:

Applicants cannot be on the Abuse Registry or have a theft conviction. Prior to class, applicants must provide Mrs. Linda Hafley with a background check from TrueScreen. and a 10 panel drug screen from any lab or medical primary care provider, clinic or health department. **The drug screen must be submitted directly from the vendor.**

CPR TRAINING AND RECERTIFICATION

This 5 hour course teaches the skills of CPR for victims of all ages in Basic Life Support (BLS) for healthcare providers through the American Heart Association. All CPR courses are strictly limited to 16 participants. Students are strongly encouraged to purchase 2015 BLS Provider Manual prior to course. Cost: \$73.50

E.K.G. TECHNICIAN - 10 Points*

This is a 49 hour course designed for the student to obtain basic knowledge of the electrical activity of the heart, EKG strip analysis, how to administer a 12 Lead EKG, and prepare patients for Holter or ambulatory monitoring. Additionally, graduates will be qualified for the optional certification exam offered by the National Healthcareer Association (NHA). Cost: \$558

Prerequisite: Students must be 18 years of age and possess a High School diploma or GED equivalent.

I.V. THERAPY

This is a 40 hour course based on INS standards for licensed nursing professionals, LPN or RN, or for the Practical Nursing Graduate. Cost: \$347

Prerequisite: Students must be a currently licensed LPN or RN, or a Practical Nursing Graduate awaiting state board licensing Confirmation.

MEDICAL TERMINOLOGY WITH ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY – 10 Points*

Learn basic medical terms as they relate to the human body in this 40 hour course. Applicants of the Health Occupations programs are encouraged to take advantage of this program. Cost: \$285

PHLEBOTOMY - 10 Points*

Phlebotomy is a 49 hour course designed for Allied Health workers who need to learn the clinical skill of Phlebotomy. Students will review universal precautions, specimen requirements, laboratory policies, and veni and capillary punctures. Students will learn from practicing live sticks on each other. Additionally, graduates will be qualified for the optional certification exam offered by the National Healthcareer Association (NHA). Cost: \$596

Prerequisite: A regular high school diploma or GED AND a current CPR Certification in Basic Life Support (BLS) through the American Heart Association. YOU MUST BRING BOTH OF THESE DOCUMENTS TO REGISTER for class!

Important note about blood borne pathogens: Due to the nature of this course, a current series of the Hepatitis B vaccine is strongly recommended!



AVAILABLE ONLINE PART-TIME COURSES

IMPORTANT NOTES: If you are taking classes to earn points for the Fall 2017 Medical Assisting, Practical Nursing, or Surgical Technology Program, you must complete your courses for points by program's application deadline. There is no need to attend the registration on **July 31, 2017** if you are interested in online courses only. To register for an online course you must utilize the appropriate web link provided. It is not possible to register for these courses at the physical campus!

TN ECAMPUS COURSE NO. 5102 ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGY FOR ALLIED HEALTH – 10 Points*

The Anatomy and Physiology course is a 80 hour online course introduces the student to essential basic information from the sciences of anatomy and physiology. This course will also allow students to earn 10 points toward the Medical Assistant, Surgical Technology, and Practical Nursing program. Cost: \$333 **

TN ECAMPUS COURSE NO. 2106 / CERTIFIED ADMINISTRATIVE PROFESSIONAL (CAP) – PART I

This course is a 25 hour online course designed to provide a basic knowledge and overview of the Certified Administrative Professional (CAP) Examination. It covers the first four areas included in the exam: communication, general knowledge of management and theories, organization and planning, information distribution, and organizational management. Cost: \$300 ***

TN ECAMPUS COURSE NO. 2107 / CERTIFIED ADMINISTRATIVE PROFESSIONAL (CAP) – PART II

This 25 hour course is a continuation of the Certified Administrative Professional I course. Cost: \$300**

TN ECAMPUS COURSE NO. DMC 1000 / DEMENTIA CARE – 10 Points*

The Dementia Care course is a 46 hour online course that is dedicated to the training and education of those caring for individuals with Alzheimer's Disease and related dementias. This course will also allow students to earn 10 points toward the Practical Nursing program. Cost: \$247**

TN ECAMPUS COURSE NO. 5211 / DOSAGE CALCULATIONS – 10 Points*

Dosage Calculations for Nurses is a 36 hour online course that provides a comprehensive overview of Dosage Calculations. The lessons, exercises, module reviews, and other interactive resources make the class a fun, attractive, and effective learning environment. This course will also allow students to earn 10 points toward the Practical Nursing program. Cost: \$411 **

TN ECAMPUS COURSE NO. 1000 / LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE REFRESHER

The Licensed Practical Nurse Refresher course is a 100 hour online course that prepares LPNs for re-entry into the field. It contains a review of medical surgical nursing, pharmacology and legal/ethical aspects of practical nursing practice. Course content is divided into two parts. The first part of the course addresses theory (70 hours), while the second part addresses clinical practice (30 hours). Students must satisfactorily complete the theory portion of the course before progressing to clinical. The clinical portion of the course must be completed in an approved healthcare facility under the supervision of a preceptor. Cost: \$502 **



Note: Any LPN who has not been engaged in the practice of nursing for five years must contact the Tennessee Board of Nursing for counsel and approval of enrollment in this course.

FOR REGISTERED DENTAL ASSISTANTS

CORONAL POLISHING

This 19 hour course is designed to teach the RDA the procedure of coronal polishing.

Prerequisite: Current Tennessee Registered Dental Assistant prior to enrolling.

Important Notes: This course is not designed for Dental Hygienists. This course is approved by the Tennessee Board of Dentistry and the student must successfully complete both written and clinical portions of the courses to be eligible to apply to the TBD to take the board examinations. Tuition does not include the registration fee to the Tennessee Board of Dentistry which the student will pay to the TBD after successful completion of the course. Cost: \$254

DENTAL SEALANTS

This 7 hour course is designed to teach the RDA the procedure of applying sealants.

Prerequisite: Current Tennessee Registered Dental Assistant

Important Notes: This course is not designed for Dental Hygienists. This course is approved by the Tennessee Board of Dentistry and the student must successfully complete both written and clinical portions of the courses to be eligible to apply to the TBD to take the board examinations. Tuition does not include the registration fee to the Tennessee Board of Dentistry which the student will pay to the TBD after successful completion of the course. Cost: \$141

MONITORING NITROUS OXIDE

This 5 hour course is designed to teach the RDA the knowledge and skills to monitor patients under nitrous oxide sedation

following the rules and regulations of the Tennessee Board of Dentistry.

Prerequisite: Current Tennessee Registered Dental Assistant

Important Notes: This course is not designed for Dental Hygienists. This course is approved by the Tennessee Board of Dentistry and the student must successfully complete both written and clinical portions of the courses to be eligible to apply to the TBD to take the board examinations. Tuition does not include the registration fee to the Tennessee Board of Dentistry which the student will pay to the TBD after successful completion of the course. Cost: \$106
